
Installation

Place iTunesMenu wherever you want (Applications, Desktop, etc...) and then open iTunesMenu.

How to use

iTunesMenu Menu

The iTunesMenu Menu is quite simple and easy to get around.



Play/Pause - Plays/Pauses iTunes.

Next/Previous - Skip songs in iTunes.

Playlist - Choose a playlist to play in iTunes.

Stars - Allows you to change the rating of a song playing in iTunes.

Quit/Launch iTunes - When iTunes is open you can use this menu to quit iTunes and when it's close you can use it to open iTunes.


About - Shows information about iTunesMenu.

Preferences - Lets you configure the function of iTunesMenu.

Alarms - Allows you to set alarms to play songs in iTunes, open files, run terminal commands, and display a message.

Quit iTunesMenu - Removes iTunesMenu from the start up items and quits iTunesMenu.

General Preferences



Status Menu Order - The order to which iTunesMenu displays information in the menu's title.

Info Menu Order - The order to which iTunesMenu displays information in the top menu item of the status menu.

iTunes Idle Menu - This is the title you wish to display when iTunes is stopped or quit.


Growl Notifications - [Growl](#) is a popular open source notification system that displays information on your screen. iTunesMenu uses it to display the song name, artist, and album when the song changes.

Scrolling - Scrolling is for when you don't have much space on your screen, you can have it scroll the information in a small area instead of expanding to the size of the information.

Menu Font - The menu font to display, you can use this to change the size and style of the status menu.

last.fm Preferences

In the last.fm Preferences you can have iTunesMenu send information about the songs you are listening to, to <http://last.fm/> so your friends can see the current song your listening to and what songs you previously listened to.




last.fm Scrobbling - Enable or disable the sending of the songs your listening to, to last.fm.

Podcast Scrobbling - Allow iTunesMenu to send the podcast you listen to, to last.fm.

Hot Keys Preferences

Hot Keys is an easy way to control iTunes when your in another application.



Play/Pause - Plays/Puases iTunes.

Next/Previous - Skips songs in iTunes.

Choose Playlist - Popups your playlists on screen for easy playlist switching.


Change Rating - Allows you to change your ratings without touching your mouse.

Volume Up/Down - Allows you to change the volume of iTunes when your in another application.

Quit/Launch iTunes - Quit or Launch iTunes at the convince of your keyboard.

Motion Preferences

The motion preferences is only for playing around, I wouldn't recommend you to use it because you yourself can cause harm to your laptop by dropping it, hitting it against object, ect... I will not pay for your computer because of your doings of using this feature.




Tap to change - Allows you to tap one of the sides of your laptop to skip songs in iTunes.

Shake to shuffle - When you shake your laptop this will shuffle your music.

Alarms

Alarms is a way to set reminders, wake up calls, backups, and many other things.



Add/Remove - Adds/Removes an alarm.

Name - Name of the alarm, name also appears in messages.

Start Time - The time the alarm starts.

Once Tab - The alarm starts only once.

Repeats Tab - The alarm starts different days of the week repeatedly.

iTunes Tab - Settings for when you want to play music in the alarm.


Open Tab - Files to open when alarm starts.

Terminal Tab - Terminal commands to run when the alarm starts.

Message Tab - Message to appear when alarm starts.

Wake my computer from sleep when an alarm should run - If you want your computer to wake up for alarms, check this and enter you password.

iTunes Tab



Enable - Enable iTunes playing when alarm goes off.


Playlist - The playlist to play when the alarm goes off.

System Volume - The volume of the system when the alarm goes off so if you muted your computer you can have iTunesMenu turn it up.

iTunes Volume - The volume of iTunes.

Fade Volume - When alarm goes off fade in the music.

Open Tab




Enable - When alarm goes off open these files.

Add - Choose files to add to the open list.

Remove - Removes files from the open list.

Terminal Tab



Enable - When alarm goes off run these terminal commands.

To test your script, use the hot key ⌘-r.


AppleScript Tab



Enable - When alarm goes off run this script.

To test your script, use the hot key ⌘-r.

Message Tab




Enable - When alarm goes off display this message.
